
EU SURVEY RESULTS

When I speak to people across the East Midlands about the European Union, there are a number of infuriating issues that we discuss.

However, none are more downright frustrating than the issue of the continued waste of money and time that is the monthly moving of the **European Parliament** to Strasbourg.

This pointless and wasteful journey costs about £131 million a year and pumps 20,000 tonnes of carbon into the atmosphere. This is because the French have a veto over the seat of Parliament being in Strasbourg (where votes are held).

EU TRADE NEGOTIATIONS CONTINUE

As a member of the International Trade **Committee in the European Parliament,** I warmly welcomed the recent conclusion of negotiations on the EU-Canada trade agreement.

It is predicted that the deal will produce annual real income gains for the EU of approximately €11.6 billion, showing exactly what the potential could be for UK and East

Midlands businesses to take advantage of this new deal.

Meanwhile negotiations are up and running again on the Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership, the new trade deal being discussed between the EU and US. I have been encouraging negotiators on this side of the Atlantic to



At the same time, we should not forget our other trade relationships around the world, and I have also taker an interest in renewing our trade relationship with Mexico. Earlier in the year I met with the outgoing Mexican ambassador to the EU, Sandra Fuentes-Berain (pictured with me), to discuss this, and I'm pleased to say that discussions have now started. In a globalised world we need to look outside the EU for real growth in future.


